The Erasmus+ program allows students to study at a foreign higher education institution abroad for a certain period. It offers them the opportunity to gain international experience, get to know a different educational environment, culture and language, and expand their knowledge and skills.

Partner higher education institutions are institutions from partner countries with which the EMUNI University has signed an ERASMUS+ bilateral agreement for students’ mobility.

This call is open to students from partner institutions who wish to undertake a study mobility at EMUNI University.

Student mobilities pursues the following objectives:

- Improving learning competencies,
- Increasing employability and employment prospects,
- Increasing initiative and entrepreneurship,
- Improving language skills,
- Increasing intercultural awareness.

Students have the opportunity to perform part of study obligations with financial support under the Erasmus+ program (Erasmus+ Mobility grant).

WHO CAN APPLY?

Students enrolled in master's degree programmes at one of the Partner Country Institutions.

HOW TO APPLY?

The applicant's institution submits the application via an [online form](#):

The deadline to apply for mobility co-financing for the second semester of the 2025/2026 academic year is 1 November 2025.

Applicants will be selected based on these criteria:

CRITERIA	EVALUATION WEIGHT
GPA of the current studies	30 %
Motivation for mobility	20 %
Knowledge of the English language (attach certificate of language proficiency)	30 %
Field of current study matching with EMUNI study programmes	20 %

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Submission of required documents/information within the deadline specified in the call text.

Duration of mobility: 3 - 4 months (one semester)

Implementation of mobility:

Autumn semester (1st sem.): From beginning of October to mid-January

Spring semester (2nd sem.): From mid-February to the end of May

Online Language Support (OLS)

All selected candidates shall take an online language test via the OLS web portal for the main language used in the host country. If the result of the online test before the mobility is B2, the student is not required to take the online test at the end of the mobility.

Mobility Agreement

Prior to the start of the mobility, the student, the home institution and the host institution sign a tripartite agreement, which defines the content of the mobility and the procedure for recognizing the learning outcomes.

Grant Agreement (Individual support for physical mobility)

Participants are entitled to receive financial support in the form of a grant, based on a signed Grant Agreement before the mobility period, where the amount will be specified, based on travel and individual support.

Calculation and payment of the final amount of the participant's grant is subject to the submission of all necessary supporting documents by the participant, as specified by the individual grant agreement.

The category "Individual support" is intended to cover costs directly linked to the subsistence of participants during the activity. In general, the amount of support depends on the country of origin of the student who would go on mobility.

Additional financial support is granted to candidates who consider himself/herself as a participant from disadvantage background. In this case, he/she describes the facts and personal circumstances in a motivation letter. Disadvantage backgrounds are categorized as follows:

- Special needs (physical, mental, intellectual or sensory deficits),
- Health problems (chronic diseases, physical and / or mental conditions that impair functioning),

- Cultural differences (problems of cultural inclusion, especially migrants / refugees, ethnic minorities)
- Social barriers (limited social competences, high-risk behaviors, family circumstances),
- Economic barriers (low income, low standard of living, poverty, unemployment, dependence on social protection),
- Barriers to discrimination (gender identity, age, ethnic discrimination, religion),
- Geographical barriers (participants from distant and / or less developed areas).

Erasmus Student Charter

Students are required to familiarize with Erasmus student charter, which is published on EMUNI website <https://emuni.si/wp-content/uploads/2021/03/ECharter-2021-27.pdf>.

Applications will be reviewed and discussed by the Erasmus Mobility Commission. A written decision regarding the selected candidates will be issued by 1 December 2025.

A candidate can appeal to the decision of the commission within 7 days after receiving the decision.
